**Details:**

On 12/15/18, at approximately 0250 hours, I was called in to for an assault with a deadly weapon investigation and assigned as case agent for File [REDACTED].

On Saturday, December 15, 2018, about 0219 hours, Deputies were dispatched to the Azteca Grill, located at 31701 Riverside Drive Suite D, Lake Elsinore, Riverside County reference a shooting in front of the location. The suspects were seen fleeing from the area in a dark colored four door sedan, after the shooting.

Video surveillance from the Azteca Bar was viewed and collected. The video footage captured the male suspects inside and outside the bar throughout the night. Witnesses stated they believed the suspect who shot [REDACTED] was known as "Flaco." Another witness believed the shooter's name was Armando. A record check through Law Enforcement databases for "Flaco" revealed that moniker was used by Armando Franco. Armando Franco's physical characteristics matched the descriptions received from witnesses at the scene and the images captured on video surveillance.

A comparison of Armando's DMV photograph and booking profile picture to the video surveillance of the suspect led me to the identification of the suspect as Armando Franco. In addition, witnesses identified Armando Franco in photographic line ups as the suspect who shot [REDACTED] three times at close range by Armando Franco.

I ran a record check through Law Enforcement Databases on Armando Franco. I learned Armando is currently on Parole from the State of California, California Department of Corrections (CDCR). I spoke to Parole Agent [REDACTED]. I learned from Agent [REDACTED] that Franco's last known phone number was [REDACTED] provided that phone number on 10/31/18 and communicated with



1 that phone number on 11/14/18 and on 11/19/18 with his Parole Agent.

2  
3 I ran the phone number [REDACTED] in various internet sites, including fonefinder.net. The sites  
4 showed the phone number is issued by T-Mobile.

5  
6 A search warrant was authored by Inv. McClanahan for the above listed cellular telephone call  
7 history and GPS precision location coordinates for the limited purpose of tracking the **Target**  
8 **Telephone Number** location and for gathering evidence which constitutes evidence of offenses  
9 in violation of (Attempt) *Penal Code section 187, (Attempt) Murder* signed by the Honorable Judge  
10 Davis on 12/18/18.

11  
12 On 12/19/2018, the above search warrant was faxed to T-Mobile requesting GPS ping location  
13 updates at fifteen-minute intervals. On 12/19/2018, at 1317 hours, I began receiving location  
14 updates for the above listed cellular telephone number.

15  
16 Armando was scheduled to appear in court on 12/20/2018 for an unrelated [REDACTED]  
17 [REDACTED] case but did not appear. On 12/20/18, after learning he did not show up for his court date,  
18 Inv. Carranza and I attempted to locate Armando by the GPS pings received from T-Mobile for  
19 his cellular telephone number. Deputy Kramer, Deputy Beaudet, and Deputy Burch, were  
20 assisting.

21  
22 The cellular pings updated every fifteen minutes and showed the cellular telephone believed to be  
23 in Armando's possession throughout the Lake Elsinore and Wildomar area. The two locations  
24 Armando frequented for extended periods of time were [REDACTED] and  
25 [REDACTED]

26  
27 On 12/20/2018, at 1333 hours, his location was [REDACTED]. I observed a dark brown or  
28 grey Ford Taurus with paper plates parked behind the location. At 1403 hours, his location  
29 changed from the [REDACTED] address. I drove by the address and saw the Ford Taurus was  
30 no longer there.

31  
32 The GPS pings until 1433 hours led me to believe Armando was mobile in the area and not at a  
33 location. At 1448 hours, the GPS ping showed Armando at [REDACTED], Wildomar. Inv.  
34 Carranza and I drove down Lemon in an unmarked vehicle without emergency lights and sirens  
35 and saw the Ford Taurus parked in front of the above location. I parked west of Jaro Drive on  
36 Lemon with a view of the intersection of Jaro and Lemon. Deputy Kramer, Beaudet, and Burch  
37 parked east of Jaro Drive near Orchard.

38  
39 About 1553 hours, I saw the Ford Taurus exit Jaro Drive and travel east on Lemon. I relayed this  
40 information to Deputy Kramer, Beaudet, and Burch. The Ford Taurus, later discovered to be  
41 driven by Armando Franco, drove down Lemon and turned north on Orchard. Deputy Kramer and  
42 Beaudet attempted to conduct a vehicle stop and a pursuit ensued. We lost sight of the Ford Taurus  
43 and deputies due to the pursuit.

1 It was broadcasted Armando crashed the Ford Taurus and an officer involved shooting took place  
2 in front of 18630 Collier Avenue, Lake Elsinore.

3  
4 We responded to termination of the pursuit and assisted with witness interviews. I spoke to  
5 [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of my interview.

6  
7 [REDACTED] was at work at 18630 Collier Avenue, [REDACTED], Lake Elsinore. These are part of  
8 the buildings Armando crashed his vehicle in front of and the parking lot where the shooting  
9 took place. [REDACTED] heard sirens and the crash from inside the business. He started to walk from  
10 the rear of the warehouse to the front door to see what was happening. He heard four to five  
11 gunshots as he approached the front door. He never made it outside to witness anything and  
12 returned inside his business to retrieve his keys to lock the front door.

13  
14 This report will be forwarded to the Central Homicide Unit.

The above item was booked into the evidence locker at the Lake Elsinore Station.

**DETAILS:**

On 12/20/18, I was working uniformed patrol in the city of Lake Elsinore, County of Riverside. About 1554 hours, I assisted deputies during pursuit of a suspect of an assault with a deadly weapon, Armando Franco. Involved deputies were advised Franco was armed and dangerous.

About 1554 hours, I witnessed a dark grey or silver Ford sedan, driving at a high rate of speed turn right onto Mission Trail from Olive St. I heard fellow deputies were in pursuit of the vehicle and the vehicle was occupied by Franco. I joined the vehicle pursuit at Mission Trail and Olive St. behind deputies Kramer #5062 and Beaudet #4513 (SET), and Deputy Burch #4328.

During the vehicle pursuit, Franco led deputies north on Mission Trail at high rates of speed and into oncoming traffic, endangering the public. The vehicle pursuit continued east on S. Main St., then west on Graham Ave./Lakeshore Blvd. to Chaney St. I took over as second unit and called the vehicle pursuit at Lakeshore Blvd. and Chaney St.

The vehicle pursuit continued west on Chaney St. toward Collier Ave. at a high rate of speed. At the intersection of Collier Ave., Franco appeared to have lost control of his vehicle and could not navigate the turn. Franco's vehicle collided with a parked vehicle in the parking lot of 18630 Collier Ave. Deputy Kramer and Deputy Beaudet's patrol vehicle continued directly behind Franco's vehicle while I turned hard to the left to create cover.

Immediately after Franco collided with the parked vehicle, he exited from the driver's side and ran north. I was about two car lengths from Franco and as he took two or three steps, turned and was holding two, black semi-automatic handguns, one in his left hand and one in his right. Franco turned toward Deputy Kramer and Deputy Beaudet pointing both handguns at them. I heard a gunshot and saw smoke from one of the handguns. I saw Franco had just shot at Deputy Kramer and Deputy Beaudet.

I took cover behind my patrol vehicle and heard several more gunshots. I advanced on Franco's position and saw he was lying supine on the ground. Deputy Kramer and I advanced on Franco and saw he had gunshot wounds to his side and leg. Deputy Burch responded to our location and medical aid was immediately summoned and rendered for Franco. I secured the handguns Franco utilized during the incident until I was relieved by Deputy Hong.

**Interview with OTH [REDACTED] :**

[REDACTED] business at 18630 Collier Avenue [REDACTED] GR Lighting Services. [REDACTED] said he was inside his business when he heard a loud crash, then the sound of gun fire. He looked outside his front door and saw a subject lying on the ground. [REDACTED] was uninjured.

**Interview with OTH [REDACTED] :**

[REDACTED] the business at 18630 Collier Avenue [REDACTED] Molding Depot. [REDACTED] said she was inside the building when she heard what she believed to be gun fire in the area but wasn't sure where it came from. She was uninjured.

Cal-Fire engine 94 arrived and treated Deputy Kramer for minor injuries. On scene was Cpt. [REDACTED] Eng. [REDACTED] and FF/Paramedic [REDACTED]. They cleared the scene within several minutes.

**Interview with WIT [REDACTED] :**

[REDACTED] stated he was working inside of the loading dock at 18650 Collier Avenue [REDACTED] Lake Elsinore. [REDACTED] said he heard sirens then looked out of the loading dock and saw a brown sedan strike a yellow parking post. A police car was right behind the brown sedan and struck the grey sedan. [REDACTED] saw an unknown subject exit the brown sedan and saw and heard gun fire come from the area of where the driver would exit the driver side door. [REDACTED] estimates a minimum of five to six shots came from the subject who had exited the driver's door of the brown sedan. That subject then ran to the right and out of sight. [REDACTED] stated he thinks the deputies in the patrol car fired back but didn't know how many times they did. [REDACTED] could not describe the subject at all.

I booked the above item into an evidence locker at the Lake Elsinore sheriff station.

**Details**

On 12/15/18, I assisted Inv. Klemp with an attempt murder investigation ( ). On 12/15/18, about 0215 hours, there was a shooting outside Azteca Bar and Grill, 31701 Riverside Dr., Lake Elsinore. During the investigation, Armando Franco was identified as a shooter.

On 12/19/18, Inv. Klemp submitted a search warrant for Armando's cellular phone location. On 12/20/18, about 1554 hours, based on Armando's phone location, it led Inv. Klemp and I to a home near Lemon St. and Jaro Dr., Wildomar. While doing surveillance in an unmarked car, we saw a gray Ford Taurus parked in front of a home on Jaro Street. We previously saw the same Taurus at a different location where Armando's phone stated he was. When the Taurus drove away on Lemon St., Deputy Beaudet #4513 and Deputy Kramer #5062, who rode in the same patrol car, tried to make a traffic stop. The Taurus did not stop, and it led to a pursuit.

When Inv. Klemp and I arrived at the end location of the pursuit, yellow crime scene tape had been put up by deputies. The pursuit terminated at an industrial business park, 18630 Collier Avenue, Lake Elsinore. I searched for witnesses at the business park and spoke to the following.

The following is a synopsis of statements, which I video recorded using my body worn camera. It is not verbatim, nor necessarily in order of conversation, and is organized for the purposes of clarity. For complete details refer to the recording of the interview.

On 12/20/18, about 1640 hours, I spoke to ( ), The Molding Depot, 18630 Collier Ave., ( ), Lake Elsinore.

( ) saw police vehicles with their emergency lights, driving east on Chaney Street. As ( ) opened the front door to figure out what was occurring, she heard a loud crash and seconds later, four or five rapid gunshots. Frightened, ( ) closed the door and hid in her business. ( ) did not see who shot or what caused the loud sound. Minutes later, ( ) walk out and saw deputies had cordoned off the scene. ( ) realized police were pursuing a vehicle and the crashing sound was it crashing into a parked vehicle.

5 gun in hand, but [REDACTED] did not know if he shot. [REDACTED] identified the police car in question as the one parked  
6 behind the suspect vehicle, which he mentioned struck the parked car occupied by two females. [REDACTED] saw  
7 a deputy, wearing a motorcycle helmet, jump over the hood of the car occupied by the females. [REDACTED] had  
8 no further information. **End of interview.**

I collected and booked the above item into the Lake Elsinore Station's evidence locker on 12/21/18.

**Details:**

On 12/20/18, I was contacted by Investigator Carranza who asked me if I could assist him and other deputies in the city of Wildomar, County of Riverside, regarding a subject identified as Armando Franco who was wanted for attempt homicide from an incident on 12/15/18. Investigator Carranza told me Franco was possibly at an address on Lemon Street. I responded to the area of Lemon Street and Orchard Street. Deputy Kramer sent a photograph of Franco to me and told me Franco was known to be driving a brown in color Ford Taurus with paper plates. I also looked at a jail booking photograph of Franco to see if he had any tattoos or other distinctive marks.

I arrived at the intersection of Orchard Street and Lemon Street about 1520 hours. About 1553 hours, Investigator Carranza advised that a Ford Taurus with paper plates had left the residence and was driving east bound on Lemon Street. As I approached Lemon Street, I saw a gray Ford Taurus with paper plates turn north onto Orchard Street. I saw a Hispanic male subject who I recognized from the jail booking photograph as Franco driving the vehicle. Franco's vehicle and my unit were about five feet apart from each other as he drove past me. As Franco drove past me, he gave me a head nod and continued north bound on Orchard Street.

I advised the perimeter units that Franco was driving the vehicle. As I turned my unit around on Lemon Street, Deputy Kramer and Deputy Beaudet who were in the same unit, turned north bound onto Orchard Street and attempted to conduct a felony stop on Franco. Franco failed to yield to Deputy Kramer and fled at a high rate of speed on Orchard Street. Deputy Kramer advised dispatch that they were in pursuit of Franco.

I was behind Kramer's unit and told dispatch that I would assume radio traffic for the pursuit.

Franco turned west bound on Olive Street and failed to stop at the marked stop sign on Olive Street. Franco continued to drive at a high rate of speed and turned north bound on Mission Trail. Franco failed to stop at the red light on Olive Street and Mission Trail. Franco continued north bound on Mission Trail and started driving on the wrong side of the road and into oncoming traffic. Franco drove with disregard for anyone else on the road.

Franco continued driving at a high rate of speed in excess of 80 mph on Mission Trail. Franco drove on the wrong side of the road and into oncoming traffic on Mission Trail and Diamond Road and ran the red light at the intersection almost causing a traffic collision.

Franco drove west bound onto Lakeshore Drive and continued on Main Street at a high rate of speed at about 50 mph. Franco failed to stop at the marked stop sign on Graham Avenue and turned south bound

1 on Graham Avenue. Franco failed to stop at the marked stop sign on Graham Avenue and Spring Street.  
2 Franco continued driving at a high rate of speed on Graham Avenue and drove into oncoming traffic.  
3 Franco failed to stop at the marked stop sign on Lindsay Street.

4  
5 Franco continued driving west bound on Graham Avenue and turned north bound on Chaney Street.

6  
7 At that point, I saw a marked black and white Lake Elsinore Police Department unit behind me and I asked  
8 the deputy to take over the pursuit since I was in an unmarked stealth unit. Deputy Miller took command  
9 of the radio. Moments later, Deputy Miller advised dispatch that Franco drove into a commercial building  
10 parking lot located at 18630 Collier Avenue in the city of Lake Elsinore.

12 Franco had collided into a yellow concrete ballard in the parking lot. As I was turning west bound on  
13 Collier Avenue, I saw Franco running west bound in the parking lot. Rather than stop in the parking lot, I  
14 chose to drive west bound on Collier Avenue in an attempt to get in front of Franco and stop him. As I  
15 was driving, I saw Franco turn his body towards Deputies Kramer and Beaudet and I saw that he was  
16 armed with two handguns. Franco pointed the guns in the direction of Deputies Kramer and Beaudet. I  
17 heard an exchange of gun shots between Franco and deputies on scene, and I saw Franco fall to the  
18 ground.

20 I stopped my unit on Collier Avenue about eighty feet from Franco, who was in the parking lot.

22 I advised dispatch that Franco was in possession of the firearms and advised that he had fallen to the  
23 ground.

25 I and responding deputies approached Franco as he lay on the ground. I saw Franco was suffering from  
26 gunshot wounds and I advised dispatch to contact Cal Fire and AMR for Franco. Arriving deputies and I  
27 started life saving measures on Franco until AMR arrived and transported Franco to the Inland Valley  
28 Medical Center.

**DETAILS:**

The following is a supplemental report regarding an officer involved shooting investigation that occurred on Thursday, December 20, 2018 at 18630 Collier Ave., in the city of Lake Elsinore. Central Homicide Unit Sgt. Mendez requested I assist in charting the deputies involved in the incident.

Upon arrival at the Lake Elsinore Station, I contacted Forensic Tech Land and initiated to chart the involved deputies in the Lake Elsinore Station conference room. Present during the charting of the involved deputies were Professional Standards Bureau (PSB) personnel, Investigator Rodriguez and Investigator Martinelli.

At approximately 2106 hours, I contacted Deputy Beaudet who was inside the Special Enforcement Team office and request to chart him. I escorted Deputy Beaudet to the conference room where Forensic Tech Land initiated the charting of Deputy Beaudet by taking photographs of him in his Riverside County Sheriff's Department uniform and duty gear.

Upon the completion of taking photographs of Deputy Beaudet, I began charting Deputy Beaudet's duty gear with the assistance of Forensic Tech Land who took photographs of Deputy Beaudet and his equipment throughout the process. Deputy Beaudet was wearing a green long sleeve Lake Elsinore Police shirt with Lake Elsinore Police patches printed in yellow on the shoulder area of each sleeve. Printed vertically on each sleeve in yellow below the Lake Elsinore patches was the word "Police."

Deputy Beaudet was wearing a green tactical ballistic vest above his Lake Elsinore Police long sleeve shirt. The vest had a patch with the name, "Beaudet" stitched in yellow on the right side of the vest below Deputy

Beaudet's collar and a patch with the word, "Police" printed in yellow below Deputy Beaudet's name patch. The vest had a Riverside County Sheriff's Department badge patch on the upper left side of the vest below Deputy Beaudet's collar. The back of the vest had a patch with the name "Beaudet" stitched in yellow on the upper center area of the vest below the neck area and a large patch with the word, "Police" printed in yellow lettering that ran horizontal across the entire back of the vest. The police patch was below Deputy Beaudet's name patch.

The vest had several pouches used to store his magazines, duty radio, handcuffs, oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray, flashlight and collapsible baton. The back of the vest had a handcuff pouch on the lower right side of the vest and a second handcuff pouch on the lower left side of the vest. Deputy Beaudet was wearing a tactical green battle dress uniform (BDU) style pants containing several pockets. Deputy Kramer had a black knife in the front left pocket of his pants and black gloves on his left leg side pants.

Deputy Beaudet had on a nylon duty belt and black boots. Deputy Beaudet had the following gear placed inside the pouches of his tactical vest: two .40 caliber fifteen round magazines loaded to capacity with Federal S&W ammunition, a can of department issued OC spray, department issued radio attached to a remote speaker/microphone, three handcuffs, flash light, flash drive and pens.

I placed Deputy Beaudet's nylon duty belt on butcher paper and documented the equipment on his belt. Deputy Beaudet had a hard plastic taser holster that contained his department issued Taser X-2 (Serial [REDACTED]) containing two live cartridges inserted in the taser feed on the left side of his belt.

Deputy Beaudet had a hard-plastic firearm holster with his duty weapon holstered inside. I removed Deputy Beaudet's firearm from his holster. The firearm was a black Glock 22 .40 caliber semi-automatic firearm (Serial [REDACTED]) with a "Streamlight TLR-1" tactical light inserted in the lower rail of the firearm. The firearm had one round chambered and a magazine inserted in the magazine feed. I removed the fifteen-round capacity magazine from the firearm and located fourteen rounds inserted in the magazine for a total of fifteen rounds including the chambered round. The ammunition were all .40 caliber Federal S&W.

Dut to Deputy Beaudet having three fifteen round capacity magazines (including magazine inserted in the firearm magazine feed) with two magazines loaded to capacity except for the magazine inserted in the magazine feed of the firearm that had fourteen rounds, I determined Deputy Beaudet should have 45 rounds, including the chambered round, but was missing one round.

All the .40 caliber ammunition were Federal S&W ammunition. Deputy Beaudet stated he was missing one round from the magazine inserted in the magazine feed of his firearm because he recently attended a firearm training where he loaded the magazine and chambered a round into the firearm. Deputy Beaudet failed to load the inserted magazine to capacity when he chambered a round into the firearm (Refer to the photographs for the above described charting of Deputy Beaudet).

Upon completion of charting Deputy Beaudet and duty gear he wore during this incident, I gave back Deputy Beaudet his duty gear. The charting of Deputy Beaudet was concluded at 2144 hours. A copy of this report will be forwarded to Investigator Johnson for final disposition.

**DETAILS**

The following is a synopsis of what I recall occurred during the Officer Involved Shooting on 12-20-2018. I video recorded the incident with my body worn camera. This report is not meant to take the place of the actual recording. For complete details refer to the video recording.

On 12-20-18, 5L410 and Investigators were surveilling a residence in the city of Wildomar for Armando Franco who was wanted in connection with and attempted murder with a firearm in the city of Lake Elsinore. At approximately 1554 hours, I heard a radio broadcast that 5L410 was in pursuit of the attempted murder suspect north on Mission Trail approaching the city of Lake Elsinore from the city of Wildomar. I responded from the Lake Elsinore Station to Main St. and Limited Ave. While there, I heard the pursuit over the radio approaching my location. I observed the suspect vehicle traveling east on Main St. from Lakeshore Dr. with several units in pursuit behind it. I entered into the pursuit with the other units, traveling east on Main St. I was the fourth unit in the pursuit following a marked Sheriff utility vehicle.

The pursuit continued east on Main St. and proceeded north on Graham Ave. The suspect was driving on the wrong side of the road and at a high rate of speed. I continued north on Graham Ave. to Chaney St, where the suspect made a right turn and proceeded east on Chaney St. At this point there were three units ahead of me in the pursuit and the suspect was still failing to yield. The suspect continued at a high rate of speed on Chaney St traveling north towards Collier Ave.

I observed the suspect vehicle enter a parking lot at 18630 Collier Ave. and collide with a vehicle in the parking lot. At this point I heard, "gun, gun, gun, he's got a gun" broadcast over the radio. As I pulled up and dismounted my motorcycle, I heard several shots being fired and observed the attempted murder suspect running north through the parking lot with two hand guns in his hands.

I heard more shots being fired and saw the suspect fall to the ground and two guns fall out of his hands. On my right I saw Deputies Kramer, Miller and Glaser closing the distance towards the suspect and told them to watch for crossfire as we all approached the suspect and placed him into custody. I observed two handguns on the ground next to the suspect, one which looked like a Glock and the other was a black semi-automatic handgun. I advised over the radio the suspect was down and all Deputies were un-injured.

Myself, Deputies Glaser and Kramer started assessing the injuries to the suspect. The suspect had gunshot wounds to his legs and chest. I cut the suspects belt off, in order to remove his pants and treat a gunshot





1 wound to his right leg. I placed a tourniquet on his upper right leg to stem the bleeding from his leg wound  
2 and assisted Deputy Kramer in putting a piece of a rubber tourniquet over a sucking chest wound. I also  
3 observed a gunshot wound to his left foot and removed his shoe and sock to facilitate treatment.

4  
5 At this point Cal Fire was arriving on scene and I removed the suspects handcuffs in order to assist Cal  
6 Fire in medical treatment.

7  
8 At this point the scene was secured and I was told by my supervisor, Sgt. Woodland, to follow American  
9 Medical Response (AMR) to Inland Valley Medical Center with the suspect. I followed AMR from the  
10 shooting scene to Inland Valley Medical Center (IVMC) in the city of Wildomar.

11  
12 While at IVMC, the suspect was being treated by several Doctors and medical staff. There were gunshot  
13 entry/exit wounds to the suspects left foot, left calf, inside right thigh, outside right thigh, upper right  
14 chest, back right shoulder, and to the left of his spine near the middle of his back.

15  
16 The suspect was moved to operating room number two for emergency surgery. Dr. [REDACTED] Dr. [REDACTED] and  
17 Dr. [REDACTED] all tended to the suspect during the surgery.

18  
19 While at IVMC I was provided evidence from the suspect by medical staff. The evidence was placed into  
20 brown paper bags. Deputy Willow took possession of the evidence as I was unable to transport it back the  
21 the Elsinore Sheriffs Station because I could not carry it on my motorcycle.

22  
23 I was relieved by Deputy Willow at 1734 hours to return to the Lake Elsinore Station for the Central  
24 Homicide Unit.

25  
26 I have no further information regarding the suspect. Please refer to Deputy Willow's supplemental report  
27 for further suspect information after 1734 hours.

There were two firearms on the ground near Franco and I directed Deputy Miller and Deputy Burch to stand near them to ensure neither was touched or moved by responding medical personnel.

California Department of Forestry (CDF) and American Medical Response (AMR) arrived on scene. CDF and AMR took over medical aid on Franco. Franco was transported to Inland Valley Medical Center for further medical treatment by AMR.

All deputies were removed from the scene of the incident and responded to the command post. I collected Body Worn Cameras (BWCs) from Deputies Kramer, Burch, Beaudet, Miller, and Glaser. I secured the BWCs in my patrol unit until they were given to Investigator Manjarrez of the Central Homicide Unit. I remained at the command post until 2033 hours, when I returned to watch commander responsibilities for the station.

**DETAILS**

On Thursday, December 20, 2018 around 1550 hours, I was wearing my department issued uniform, driving a marked black and white Lake Elsinore Police Ford Explorer. I responded to a request for spike strips to be set up on Main Street. The requesting deputies were in pursuit of a Hispanic male adult who was a suspect in an attempted murder that occurred on December 15 in the city of Lake Elsinore, County of Riverside. I responded from the Lake Elsinore Station and attempted to get to a location to deploy the strips; however, the vehicle was travelling at such a speed that I was unable to get into a position to deploy the spikes safely.

Knowing the suspect was possibly armed and dangerous I joined the pursuit as the third black and white Lake Elsinore Police unit. The pursuit continued north on Chaney where it ultimately ended when the suspect crashed and disabled his vehicle in the parking lot of a business complex the intersection of Collier and Chaney. I stopped my vehicle on Collier Avenue and exited my vehicle, I heard three to four gunshots fired from the suspects direction. I then heard gunshots coming from the direction of the lead vehicle. As I ran toward the parking lot I saw the suspect fall to the ground. Deputy's Kramer, Burch, Miller and myself approached the suspect. Deputy Kramer and I placed the suspect in hand cuffs. Next to the suspect were two hand guns. One of the handguns was in the slide lock position the other appeared to be ready to fire.

I returned to the suspect vehicle and ensured there was no additional people hiding in the vehicle. Once the vehicle was deemed safe, I returned to the suspect and assisted with life-saving efforts. The suspect had multiple gunshot wounds to his body. Deputy Foster assisted me with placing a tourniquet on the suspects right leg and continued assisting with the life saving efforts with the fire department.

Once the suspect was transported, I assisted Deputy Willow in checking two properties that are just east from where the incident occurred. The house located at [REDACTED] is vacant and no one was inside the residence. The house located [REDACTED] had two residents inside at the time of the incident, neither resident was injured and inly exited the house after the incident occurred.

**SYNOPSIS:**

This report details a portion of an officer involved shooting investigation, in the parking lot of 18600 Block of Collier Ave., Lake Elsinore.

████████████████████ work together at Quad County Mobile Home Services, located at 18630 Collier Ave., █████ in the City of Lake Elsinore. This location is the business complex where the traffic collision occurred, just before the officer involved shooting occurred. █████ vehicle was parked very close to where the suspect's vehicle collided.

**DETAILS:**

I am an investigator currently assigned to the Riverside County Sheriff's Dept., Lake Elsinore Station Detective Bureau. On 12/20/18, at approximately 1600 hours, I was assigned to respond to an officer involved shooting at the intersection of Collier Ave. and Chaney St., in the City of Lake Elsinore.

I arrived at the location at approximately 1625 hours, and entered the crime scene through the southeast entrance along Collier Ave. I never entered into the parking lot where the incident occurred.

I met with my supervisor, Sgt. Seckinger. I was then assigned to conduct interviews of possible witnesses. I was given further instructions to take over interviews from Dep. Hansen, who was in the process of interviewing witnesses.

**Interview with █████**

On 12/20/18, at approximately 1630 hours, I conducted a digitally recorded interview of █████, at the intersection of Chaney St., just west of Collier Ave. █████ was seated on the northwest curb of Chaney St., talking to Dep. Hansen when I contacted her. █████ was visibly upset, cried and shook uncontrollably several times throughout the interview. The following is a summary of █████ statement. Refer to the digital recording for exact details.

I contacted █████ after speaking to and being briefed by Dep. Hansen. █████ told me she was inside her car, seated in the driver's seat, getting ready to leave after working her shift. █████ had only been in her car for approximately ten seconds. █████ was outside of her car on the passenger side, preparing to get into the car. █████ heard a screeching noise and believed her other co-worker, █████ had just been involved in a traffic collision because she drove out of the parking lot, just before she heard the loud noise. █████ exited her car from the driver's door because she was still hearing the loud noise and was going to run towards Chaney St., where █████ had driven towards. █████ saw a car hit the pole but also thought it hit her car. █████ saw the deputies right behind the suspect's vehicle. █████ described how the suspect fell out of his car and then got up and began to run.

2 ■■■■ said when the suspect fell out of the car, "his gun fell." ■■■■ said she yelled at ■■■■ to get  
3 down because she saw the gun. ■■■■ said as she was about to run, the suspect picked up his gun,

6 hair and brown eyes. [REDACTED] could not remember what he was wearing.

8 I asked [REDACTED] if she ever saw the officers shooting. [REDACTED] said she did not see them shooting. [REDACTED]  
9 never saw a muzzle flash from a gun.  
10

11 Inv. Cardinale interviewed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Refer to his Supplemental Report  
12 for additional details.  
13

14 At approximately 1740 hours, I was ordered by Lt. Magnan to transport Dep. Beaudet, and Dep.  
15 Miller back to the Lake Elsinore Station. Inv. Klemp rode to the station with us. I assisted Inv.  
16 Klemp at the Station with reviewing data related to the suspect. I took no other action in this  
17 investigation.

On 12/26/18 about 1330 hours, I entered the above listed item into the ELEETS computer located at the Lake Elsinore Sheriff Station. I then placed the item into a secure evidence locker also located at the station.

**DETAILS**

On Thursday, December 20, 2018, about 1600 hours, I responded to the area of Collier Avenue and Chaney Street in the city of Lake Elsinore, within Riverside County to assist with an officer involved shooting that had just occurred. I arrived on scene about 1610 hours to assist with the investigation.

Upon my arrival, I was assigned to assist with setting up crime scene tape and locating potential witnesses. After setting crime scene tape on the southern perimeter near the entrance to the business complex at 18630 Collier Avenue, I canvased the area for potential witnesses.

I spoke with the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] while at their residence located at [REDACTED]. Their residence sits atop a small hill directly north of the incident location. Their property was located in the backdrop behind Armondo Franco when he was shot. They told me they were the only two people on the property and were both inside the residence when they heard the shooting. They heard a total of 6-7 shots but believed it was more likely only 6 shots total. They looked out the kitchen window and saw the commotion in the parking lot. They were uninjured and stated they did not see any of the actual shooting. There was a vacant residence adjacent to their property located at [REDACTED]. They told me the located as been vacant for several years and no one stays on the property.

The front door to [REDACTED] was damaged and appeared it was possible there was a transient living inside. Deputy Glaser searched the interior and no persons were located.

I spoke with [REDACTED] who was located inside 18630 Collier Avenue [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of her statement;

[REDACTED] told me she was sitting in the front window at her desk when the incidence occurred. She initially heard sirens coming down the street and looked out just in time to see the gray car hit the dip in the roadway and then hit what she believed was the blue car parked in the parking lot. Then the police unit hit the gray car. He saw the guy in the gray car (Franco) exit the car, fall and then run away from the scene. Franco then turned around and started shooting at the Deputies. She heard the deputies say several times to put the gun down. She estimated she heard a total of 10 shots. She stated Franco shot three times before the Deputies returned fire. She locked the front door and ran to the back of the store. She did hear the Deputies say, "Get on the ground" during the shooting. She estimated she heard "Get on the ground" 4 times.



1 I spoke with [REDACTED] who was located inside 186330 Collier Avenue [REDACTED]. The following is a summary  
2 of his statement; [REDACTED] told me he was initially in the back shop when he heard the sounds of gun fire. He ran  
3 to the front of the store and saw the officer, Deputy Kramer, shooting through the broken window of the police  
4 car. He said he could hear an officer say something "Down". He believed it was "Lay down" or "Stay down"  
5 something to that effect.

6  
7 I spoke with [REDACTED] who was located inside 18650 Collier Avenue [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of  
8 his statement; [REDACTED] told me his was in the middle of the warehouse when he heard a vehicle crash. He  
9 walked towards the ramp and was going to check to see if anyone was injured. He arrived near the opening and  
10 saw a guy wearing black pull out a gun and start shooting deputies. He estimated there were at least 6 shots  
11 fired. Saw police run after him and fire one shot and that was the last shot. He heard deputies yell several times  
12 to get on the ground and at least one time he heard what he believed was "Drop your weapon." He never heard  
13 Franco say anything to the officers.

14  
15 I spoke with [REDACTED] who was located inside 18650 Collier Avenue [REDACTED] when the incident occurred.  
16 The following is a summary of his statements;

17  
18 [REDACTED] told me he was sitting at his desk when he heard sirens in the area. He heard the sound of gun shots and  
19 he was still inside his office. He estimated he heard about 20 shots fired but it is hard because the area echoes.

20  
21 I cleared the scene about 1800 hours and drove Deputy Hansen to the Lake Elsinore Sheriff Station. I  
22 responded to Inland Valley Medical Center about 1904 hours to relieve Deputy Foster. I arrived at the hospital  
23 about 1926 hours. Deputy Foster provided me with two paper bags containing items from Franco. In one bag  
24 was a pair of boxers and in the other, a watch and a denture.

25  
26 Franco was still in the operating room when I arrived. He was moved to the intensive care unit bed 16 about  
27 1945 hours. Upon arriving in the IVU, Franco lost a pulse and was not breathing. CPR was initiated at 1949  
28 hours and continued for several minutes. Dr. [REDACTED] announced time of death of 2015 hours. I notified  
29 Sergeant Woodland of the death. Investigator Barajas was notified and responded to the hospital. I was relieved  
30 by Investigator Barajas and the Deputy Coroner.

31  
32 I cleared the hospital about 2100 hours and responded to the Lake Elsinore Station. I provided Investigator  
33 Manjarrez the personal items from Franco.

34  
35 I responded back to the scene and arrived about 2145 hours. I assisted with conducting the investigation into  
36 the traffic collision portion of the investigation. With Sergeant Warrington's approval, I requested Stericlean to  
37 the scene to clean up the body fluids. When I cleared the scene at 0330 hours, Deputy Hong was the only  
38 deputy on scene. I had no further involvement in this case.

39



**DETAILS:**

On Thursday, 12/20/18, at 1554 hours, I was working uniformed patrol for the Riverside County Sheriff's Department in the city of Lake Elsinore. I was in full uniform and riding a marked police motorcycle. I was specifically assigned to the Lake Elsinore Traffic Bureau.

I heard a call go out of a vehicle pursuit involving an attempt murder suspect from a week prior. The pursuit was traveling northbound on Lakeshore coming towards my location. I posted up with my motorcycle at Limited Avenue and Main Street in Lake Elsinore. I had my lights on warning motorist. The motorist came to a stop at my position.

The pursuit of the suspect past my location at approximately 1557 hours. The suspect vehicle rode into the eastbound shoulder, traveling at approximately 45 miles per hour, passing the stopped vehicles. The suspect vehicle was being followed by one unmarked police vehicle and two marked police vehicles. I was with my partner, Deputy Foster (MO60). As the pursuit passed us, Deputy Foster fell into the number four position of the pursuit. I followed in the number five position in the pursuit. Due to the reports of the suspect having two firearms in his possession, having attempted the murder of two subjects, and being a known gang member, Deputy Foster and I trailed the pursuit. This decision was a direct reflection on our assessment of the danger and wanting to protect our fellow law enforcement officers.

The pursuit continued eastbound on Main Street until we reached Graham Avenue. The pursuit continued northbound on Graham Avenue towards Chaney Street at speeds of approximate 50-70 miles per hour. As the pursuit continued to eastbound Chaney Street, I observed another unit trailing me. I backed off to let the unit pass me. I recognized the unit as Deputy Glaser (5L412). I pulled back behind Deputy Glaser and continued eastbound. As we approached the intersection with Collier Avenue, I observed the suspect vehicle go into a parking lot and crash. I heard the deputy calling out the pursuit yell the suspect had crashed. I heard on my radio, "Gun, gun, gun!"

As I was stopping my motorcycle at the intersection, I heard 2-4 gun shots, followed by 6-10 gun shots in a more rapid succession. I observed the suspect running northbound through the parking lot with objects in his hands. As I was putting down my kick-stand, I observed the suspect fall down to the ground in the parking lot of 18630 Collier Avenue. As I rushed forward with other officers, I observed Deputy Beaudet, on the passenger side of his vehicle with a vehicle at gun point. It appeared he had other persons involved at gun point. I ran to assist Deputy Beaudet as other officers ran towards the fallen suspect.

As I arrived at Deputy Beaudet's location, I observed two females. One white female, later identified as [REDACTED], and a black female, later identified as [REDACTED] was prone out on the ground,



1 face down, by the passenger side of her vehicle. [REDACTED] was crouched down in the floor board of the  
2 passenger side of the same vehicle. My first thought was these were accomplices in the suspect vehicle. I  
3 had the two females at gun point when I ordered the females to show me their hands and to stay down. I  
4 quickly came to realize these two females were victims in a different vehicle. I looked over my shoulder  
5 and observed the suspect was still down and not moving. The suspect was surrounded by multiple  
6 deputies. I immediately holstered my weapon and went to the two females aid.

7  
8 I asked both females if they were injured. Both females were very hysterical and going into shock,  
9 however, had no physical injury. Both were screaming for [REDACTED] was on face-time with [REDACTED]  
10 [REDACTED] I told both females they were going to be ok and tried to talk them down to being in a calm state. I  
11 told [REDACTED] on face-time [REDACTED] was safe, but I couldn't tell her specifics about what  
12 happened. I had [REDACTED] end her phone call with [REDACTED]. I had [REDACTED] leave her phone in the vehicle.  
13 Both females kept looking at the downed suspect. I had both females follow me around the corner, to  
14 remove them from the immediate scene of the downed suspect.

15  
16 I escorted [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] outside of the perimeter being set up. Outside the perimeter, I waited with  
17 [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] A third witness arrived, later identified as [REDACTED] stated she had  
18 witnessed part of the incident. [REDACTED] stated the following:

20 [REDACTED] was exited the parking lot at 18630 Collier Avenue, having just left her employment. [REDACTED]  
21 observed the suspect vehicle and the pursuing police vehicles traveling right towards her at a high rate of  
22 speed. [REDACTED] exited just as the suspect vehicle came right towards her, then passed her on the left. As  
23 [REDACTED] was traveling westbound on Chaney Street, [REDACTED] heard several gun shots. [REDACTED] stopped and  
24 turned around fearing [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had been injured. [REDACTED] stopped and waited until I  
25 had walked up with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

26  
27 I waited with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], until Investigator McClanahan arrived at my location. Investigator  
28 McClanahan took over at my position with the witnesses. I did nothing further in this investigation.

**DETAILS:**

On 12/20/18, at approximately 1554 hours, I was working as the City of Lake Elsinore Watch Commander. While on patrol, I heard (VIC) Deputy Kramer and (VIC) Deputy Beaudet announce over the radio that they were in a vehicle pursuit of a homicide suspect. This pursuit was initiated at Orchard Street x Olive Street, Lake Elsinore. As soon as the deputies announced they were in pursuit, I recalled that they were assisting the Lake Elsinore Investigations Bureau and indeed were looking for an attempted homicide suspect, ref [REDACTED] I authorized the pursuit and immediately responded from the area near Highway 74 x Riverside Street, Perris.

While driving, I heard (OTH) Deputy Burch announce he was second in the pursuit and was going to radio the pursuit as Deputy Kramer and Deputy Beaudet pursued. At 1558 hours, I heard (OTH) Deputy Miller announce he was going to take over radio responsibilities for Deputy Burch. At 1559 hours, Deputy Burch announced that the suspect was involved in a collision, the suspect had a firearm, and that shots were fired. This incident occurred at 18630 Collier Avenue. I arrived on scene at approximately 1601 hours.

As I arrived, I saw (OTH) Sergeant Woodland taking command of the scene. I was able to see the suspect on the ground suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. Deputies were administering first aid and requesting medical resources for the suspect over the radio. I checked deputies, citizens, and witnesses for injuries. After ensuring the safety of all in or near the scene, I coordinated with Sergeant Woodland to assign supervisory duties and deputy duties.

At 1657 hours, I left the scene to coordinate assets arriving at the Lake Elsinore Station.

On 12/28/2018, I booked the listed evidence into the evidence locker at the Lake Elsinore Station.

**DETAILS**

On Thursday, December 20, 2018, I was assigned to the Lake Elsinore Station Traffic Bureau, driving a black and white enforcement motorcycle. At about 1602 hours, I responded to Collier Avenue and Chaney Street to assist at the scene. Upon arrival, I put up crime scene tape up across Collier Avenue, south of Chaney street for an outer perimeter.

I checked with the businesses at 18650 Collier Ave. for any witnesses of the incident. I spoke to [REDACTED] at Reliant Aluminum in [REDACTED]. He told me he was sitting in a chair on the west side of the building, closest to Collier Ave. talking to [REDACTED]. As they were talking, he began to hear the sirens. As the sirens got louder, he focused his attention to the intersection of Collier Ave. and Chaney St. [REDACTED] stated it is an active intersection for traffic collisions. He noticed a car stopped at the stop sign on Chaney St. at Collier Ave. Next, he noticed a dark vehicle speed around a vehicle that was stopped, and drive through the intersection at over 50 MPH. [REDACTED] heard the car crash and started to go help the driver. [REDACTED] heard about five gunshots, so he waited inside his shop. [REDACTED] stated he heard people yelling but could not make out what was being said.

[REDACTED] has video surveillance on the exterior of his building that faces toward the intersection. He is unable to copy the video, so I used my VieVu recorder to video. I copied the video onto a CD-r and booked it into evidence.

[REDACTED] works for the owner of the building and was at the property during the incident. [REDACTED] was sitting with [REDACTED] when he also heard the sirens. [REDACTED] did not the vehicle but heard the crash. He was concern for the property damage because it sounded like the vehicle crashed into the building. [REDACTED] started running through the parking lot toward the accident. [REDACTED] heard multiple gun shots, so he quickly turned around and ran back into [REDACTED] building. [REDACTED] stated he heard male voices yelling but was not sure what was said. [REDACTED] stated his vehicle was parked on the other side of the building, near where the shooting occurred. [REDACTED] had no further information.

I remained at the location assisting with scene security until about 2350 hours.

The VieVu recording was later placed onto a CD-r and booked into evidence at the Lake Elsinore Station.

The vehicle was not searched at the time of scene processing and was towed to the RSO Perris Station for a detailed search. It should be noted Deputy Peterson and Willow were assigned the collision investigation to this incident.

7. A 2017 Ford Explorer marked black and white Lake Elsinore Police unit. Unit #16-021 bearing California exempt plate 1522176. R/O County of Riverside, 5293 Mission Blvd, Riverside, CA 92509. This vehicle was involved in the incident and identified as Deputy Kramer's police unit. The driver side door window was shattered. This vehicle collided with the rear bumper of the suspect vehicle (Vehicle #6). This unit had moderate collision damage to the front bumper. The collision caused the passenger door to be misaligned as the door did not close properly. The unit contained a Smith and Wesson M&P 15 patrol rifle bearing serial number [REDACTED] and a Remington Shotgun bearing serial number [REDACTED]. Both these firearms were secured in the middle console locking mechanism. These firearms were not used during the incident.

#### **DETAILS:**

On Thursday, 12/20/18, I was assigned to the Riverside County Sheriff's Central Homicide Unit and was the acting on call investigator. At about 1630 hours, I received a phone call from Sgt. Mendez, who requested I respond to an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) that occurred at 18630 Collier Ave, Lake Elsinore. I responded from the field and arrived at the scene at about 1800 hours. I noticed Collier Ave was shut down with police tape and was manned by police unit on both the east and west side of Collier. There were also police units on Chaney Street x Minthorn St. preventing any access into the scene from Chaney St. The scene was adequately secured.

The above-mentioned law enforcement personnel were present or arrived shortly thereafter. At about 1843 hours, Sgt. Seckinger and Sgt. Woodland gave a briefing regarding this incident. See Investigator Johnson's supplemental report for further details about the briefing. The briefing ended at 1858 hours. At about 1903 hours, the following personnel conducted a walk-thru of the scene, Sgt. Mendez, Inv. Johnson, Inv. Moody, FT Land, FT Almendariz, DDA Jennifer Garcia, and me. After the walk through FT Almendariz and I formed a plan to process the scene. FT Land later arrived and assisted in FT Almendariz. During the scene processing Inv. Samosky was present.

At about 1936 hours, Forensic Technician Almendariz and I (Investigator Alfaro) started to process the scene. During this time, overall photographs of the scene were taken by Forensic Technician Almendariz. During the processing of the scene, I pointed out the above-listed items of evidence I wanted photographed, documented, and collected. The processing of the scene consisted of photographs and placing numeric and alphabetic placards by the items of evidence at my direction. Forensic Technician Almendariz photographed all items of evidence. I had FT Almendariz and FT Land use the FARO laser scanner to obtain a sketch of the scene.



1 I started the scene processing by documenting Deputy Kramer's Police Unit (Vehicle #7). I located  
2 evidence item MA-01 through MA-10 inside the police unit. To the west of the police unit was  
3 evidence item MA-11 through MA-24. This area was identified where suspect Franco was arrested,  
4 treated for medical aid, and was subsequently transported by ambulance. There was medical  
5 intervention trash in this area along with a pair of handcuffs and a tourniquet which was identified as  
6 belonging to deputies. These items were not collected for evidence.

7  
8 To the north of the parking lot I observed a strike mark to the south wall of the building. It appears  
9 this is a bullet strike mark traveling from east to west. I labeled this strike mark as Photographic point  
10 "B". I searched for other strike marks or bullet holes in the building and vehicles parked at the  
11 parking lot and did not find any. I did locate a damaged curb at the east entry driveway. I labeled this  
12 as photograph point "A". It appears the damage was caused by the suspect vehicle right front  
13 passenger tire. This tire was damaged (blown out) and it matched up with the trail it left on the curb  
14 and asphalt to the point of rest of tire. It appears the suspect vehicle was traveling at a high rate of  
15 speed and attempted to make a left (west) turn but was unsuccessful and crashing into a yellow  
16 barricade cement pole. It should be noted Deputy Petersen and Deputy Willow were assigned to  
17 conduct the collision investigation.

18  
19 The processing of the scene concluded at 0420 hours. I had Inv. Johnson transport and enter all  
20 evidence to the RSO Lake Elsinore Station.

21  
22 This report was generated to document the scene. This report will be forwarded to Investigator  
23 Johnson.

The above listed item was placed into an evidence locker at the Lake Elsinore Station.

**NOTIFICATION**

On 12/20/18, I was assigned as an Investigator at the Lake Elsinore Sheriff Station and was informed an officer involved shooting occurred near the intersection of Chaney Street and Collier Avenue, in the city of Lake Elsinore. At approximately 1623 hours, I arrived in the area and saw the intersection was blocked off with crime scene tape. Sergeant Seckinger from the Lake Elsinore Station tasked me with conducting interviews with two possible witnesses that were in the area when the shooting occurred.

**DETAILS**

At approximately 1630 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] on Chaney Street southwest of Collier Avenue. This summary is not verbatim and has been condensed for purposes of clarity and is not necessarily in the order in which discussed. This synopsis is not meant to either replace or to be an exact record of what is in the recording. The interview was audio recorded and the following is a synopsis of the interview:

**INTERVIEW** [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] were leaving from their work at Quad County Mobile Home Services, located in the nearby business park at 18630 Collier Avenue, [REDACTED]. After leaving the building, [REDACTED] was the first to drive away from the parking lot. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] entered [REDACTED] 2011 blue Honda Civic (CA [REDACTED]) that was parked in a parking spot in front of the business while [REDACTED] sat in the driver seat and [REDACTED] in the front passenger seat. An additional [REDACTED] had also just left from work. [REDACTED] could not provide me with his last name but knew he drove a 2018 magenta VW Beetle. [REDACTED] did not believe [REDACTED] saw the shooting but suspected he might have known an incident occurred.



1 While inside the car, [REDACTED] heard tires squealing and a loud crash come from behind them. At first, [REDACTED]  
2 believed [REDACTED], who already left the parking lot, was involved in a collision, but [REDACTED] then felt the car she  
3 was in move.  
4

5  
6 After the crash, [REDACTED] saw the suspect, described as a Hispanic male adult, approximately 30 years old, 5'10"  
7 to 6' tall, wearing a dark colored hooded sweatshirt and jeans, running through the parking away from [REDACTED]  
8 and [REDACTED]. When the suspect was approximately 30 feet away, he pointed a black handgun towards [REDACTED] and  
9 yelled at her to "get the fuck down." The suspect was running forward while looking backwards and extended  
10 one of his arms (possibly right arm) with the handgun towards their direction. [REDACTED] then exited the driver seat  
11 leaving the driver door open and ran around the car to [REDACTED] who remained in the front passenger seat.  
12

13 [REDACTED] saw the suspect fire the handgun approximately 2-4 times towards the deputies and one deputy returned  
14 the fire (unknown how many) at the suspect. One of the deputies, who thought [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were with the  
15 suspect, pointed his weapon at them; however, once the deputy learned [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were not involved,  
16 he began consoling them and trying to calm them down. The deputy gave her water and allowed [REDACTED] to call  
17 [REDACTED] stated she was physically okay but was emotionally shaken up. [REDACTED] provided no further  
18 information.  
19

22 After speaking with [REDACTED], at approximately 1653 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] on Chaney Street  
23 southwest of Collier Avenue. This summary is not verbatim and has been condensed for purposes of clarity and  
24 is not necessarily in the order in which discussed. This synopsis is not meant to either replace or to be an exact  
25 record of what is in the recording. The interview was audio recorded and the following is a synopsis of the  
26 interview:

## 28 INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

29  
30 [REDACTED] was the manager at Quad County Mobile Home Services and [REDACTED]  
31 had just left work for the day. [REDACTED] was the driver and sole occupant of her black Kia Forte (CA. [REDACTED])  
32 and was pulling out of the business park driveway onto Collier Avenue. [REDACTED] was going to make a left-hand  
33 turn onto Collier (southeast), but she saw the suspect's vehicle driving northeast in the center median of  
34 Chaney Street driving towards her direction. [REDACTED] thought the suspect vehicle was going to collide into her,  
35 so she decided to proceed driving straight ahead, which was southwest on Chaney Street.  
36

37 The suspect vehicle and the pursuing police vehicles passed her and proceeded into the driveway of the  
38 business park, located at 18630 Collier Avenue, towards the direction where [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were at. Through  
39 [REDACTED] rear-view mirror, she saw [REDACTED] running around her car and the suspect running (what she motioned  
40 as being northwest with her arms) through the parking lot. [REDACTED] claimed she saw one of the pursuing deputies  
41 fire a gun at the suspect while she looked through her rear side mirror; however, [REDACTED] later recanted and  
42 could not recall if she witnessed the deputy shooting or believed he fired a weapon based on the gunshots she  
43 heard and witnessing the deputy holding a handgun.  
44

45 [REDACTED] made a U-turn on Chaney Street to drive back where [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were at. As she was turning her  
46 vehicle around on Chaney Street she heard multiple gunshots.

1  
2 After completing the U-turn, [REDACTED] parked her vehicle along the curb on the northeast side of Collier Avenue,  
3 which she indicated was at the dead-end of the "T" where Chaney Street intersected with Collier Avenue.  
4 When she parked, she saw [REDACTED] in the front passenger side of [REDACTED] vehicle and [REDACTED] on the ground near  
5 [REDACTED] consoling her.  
6

7 [REDACTED] described the suspect as a Hispanic male adult, approximately 25-30 years old, wearing what she  
8 believed was a gray shirt and pants. When the suspect was on the ground after the incident, [REDACTED] believed the  
9 suspect had tattoos on his stomach. I asked [REDACTED] what she heard besides the gunshots. [REDACTED] said she only  
10 heard [REDACTED] crying after the incident stating she needed to talk with [REDACTED] and that the suspect pointed a gun  
11 at her. [REDACTED] provided no further information and I ended my interview with her.  
12

15 After interviewing [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], I was told that there were two other possible witnesses inside [REDACTED]  
16 who were later identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I was informed these two  
17 witnesses were already interviewed by Deputy Willows. I did not conduct any additional interviews and did not  
18 have any additional involvement in the incident.

This item was entered into evidence at the lake Elsinore Station.

**Details:**

On Thursday, December 20, 2018, I continued with an Officer Involved Shooting investigation. The shooting involving deputies of the lake Elsinore Sheriff's station occurred on 12/20/18, at 11630 Collier Ave., in the city of Lake Elsinore where Armando Franco was shot by Deputy M. Kramer of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department Lake Elsinore station. Franco was transported to Inland Valley Hospital, where he subsequently died as a result of his injuries. At approximately 2124 hours, I interviewed Deputy Kramer #5062 inside of the Captain's office at the Riverside County Sheriff's Department, Lake Elsinore station. Present at the time of the interview were Inv. Moody, Deputy Kramer with his employee representative [REDACTED], Deputy District Attorney Jennifer Garcia and DA Inv. McGowan. The interview was audio recorded. The following is a summary of Deputy Kramer's interview. For additional details, refer to the attached transcription.

I advised Deputy Kramer that I was conducting a criminal investigation regarding the shooting and that a separate administrative investigation was being conducted by the Professional Standards Bureau. Deputy Kramer consulted with his counsel and agreed to give a voluntary statement.

[REDACTED]. At the time of the shooting, Deputy Kramer was assigned to the Problem Oriented Policing Team (POP). Prior to being assigned to POP, Deputy Kramer was assigned to [REDACTED]



1 [REDACTED] at the Lake Elsinore station. Deputy Kramer started his shift at 0700 hours and works  
2 Monday thru Thursday. Deputy Kramer's work hours are normally 0700-1700 hours. On the day of  
3 the incident, Deputy Kramer wore a green class "C" uniform with a green load bearing vest with the  
4 word, "Police" on the front right breast and a cloth Riverside County Sheriff's Department badge on  
5 the left breast. "Police" was printed across the back of the vest in block lettering. Deputy Kramer  
6 was armed with his Glock 21 .45 cal pistol. This was the only weapons system that was deployed by  
7 Deputy Kramer during the shooting.

8  
9 On 12/20/18 Deputy Kramer and his partner, Deputy Ronald Beaudet were contacted by  
10 Investigator Clemp of the Lake Elsinore station to assist in a surveillance and apprehension of  
11 wanted 664/187, 245 PC suspect Armando Franco. Franco was the suspect in a shooting that  
12 occurred on 12/15/18 at the Azteca Grill in Lake Elsinore. During the incident, two people were  
13 shot and Franco fled the scene. On 12/20/18, Investigators conducted surveillance at [REDACTED]  
14 in the city of Lake Elsinore. Investigator Clemp contacted Deputy Kramer to assist by conducting a  
15 traffic stop if Franco left the location. Deputies communicated on Elsinore car to car Channel 2  
16 during the surveillance.

17  
18 Deputy Kramer and Beaudet maintained a position on Lemon St and Orchard St. When Franco left  
19 the location in a silver Ford Taurus, Investigators notified Kramer who began following the vehicle  
20 to initiate a vehicle stop. Franco accelerated away at speeds in excess of 100 mph. Deputy Kramer  
21 attempted to catch up the vehicle while Deputy Beaudet broadcast the pursuit on Lake Elsinore  
22 primary channel with Sheriff's dispatch. As the pursuit continued on Chaney St, Franco came to the  
23 T intersection approaching Collier St. Franco attempted to turn left onto Collier but was driving too  
24 fast. Franco then drove into the parking lot of 11630 Collier Ave and crashed into the back of a  
25 parked car in the lot. Deputy Kramer saw a female standing outside on the passenger side of the car  
26 that Franco collided into. Deputy Kramer sees that Franco is out of his vehicle on the driver side  
27 and is holding two semi-automatic pistols. Franco drops one of the pistols to the ground. As Deputy  
28 Kramer enters the lot he sees Franco facing him as he tries to recover the second pistol from the  
29 ground. Deputy Kramer collides into the rear of [REDACTED] Franco's vehicle. Deputy Kramer said Franco  
30 was standing on the driver side of his vehicle. After Deputy Kramer collides into Franco's vehicle  
31 he recovers the second pistol from the ground. Franco was facing Deputy Kramer armed with two  
32 pistols. Fearing he would be shot as well as the fact that Franco had previously been involved in a  
33 shooting, Deputy Kramer fired his pistol an unknown amount of times at Franco as he tried to exit  
34 his vehicle. As Deputy Kramer exited his vehicle, Franco ran away north through the parking lot  
35 until he fell to the ground 15 to 20 yards away.

36  
37 Deputy Kramer and several other deputies approached Franco while he was on the ground. Deputy  
38 Beaudet remained with the female at the car that Franco collided into. Deputy Kramer applied a  
39 tourniquet to a gunshot wound to Franco's leg as well as a patch to a wound in his upper chest until  
40 medical personnel arrived.

41  
42 I concluded my interview with Deputy Kramer at 2233 hours. This report was generated to  
43 summarize my interview with Deputy Kramer.

9 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Correct.

10  
11 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay.

12  
13 (short pause)

14  
15 And what are your normal workdays?

16  
17 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Monday through Thursday.

18  
19 (short pause)

20  
21 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All right. Deputy Kramer, how long have you been a  
22 deputy sheriff?

23  
24 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER:

25  
26  
27 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON:

29 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER:

11 (short pause)

12  
13 And besides the pop team, have you worked any other special assignments here at the  
14 station?

15  
16 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: No, sir.

17  
18 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay.

19  
20 (short pause)

21  
22 All righty. Well, coming up -- regarding today's incident -- how did you get involved with  
23 that?

24  
25 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I was contacted by Lake Elsinore station investigators to  
26 assist making a traffic stop with a -- one of the suspects that they were looking for -- involved a  
27 shooting back here -- last week here in the city.

28  
29 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And what were your responsibilities?

30  
31 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: My partner and I were, basically, a black-and-white  
32 marked unit to set up to make a -- a traffic stop. Just -- our goal was to utilize our black-and-white  
33 to -- to conduct a stop for them.

34  
35 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: And were those detective units -- were they on a  
36 surveillance?

37  
38 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes, they were.

39  
40 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Do you know what the -- what residence or  
41 business they were -- were surveilling?

42  
43 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: They weren't -- they had a ping for a cell phone, and they

1 were, basically, following this ping around, and ultimately, it landed at a residence in Wildomar off  
2 of -- spelled [REDACTED], I believe, and they were set up at one area just watching. It  
3 was a one-way-in-one-way-out street -- cul-de-sac, and we were set up on a different side of the  
4 street -- so they were watching the -- the street, waiting for the vehicle to leave, and then they put  
5 out traffic later to let us know that -- that that car was headed our way.

6  
7 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. And what did -- what did the investigators  
8 tell you about the suspect?

9  
10 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Well, I -- I know that they had been working a  
11 [REDACTED] that occurred last week here in our  
12 city where [REDACTED]

13  
14 I know they've been working this for, like, the last week or two weeks now, and then, today,  
15 they found -- I don't know -- around 10:00 o'clock or so, they -- they texted us and asked us if we  
16 could be their marked unit for a traffic stop.

17  
18 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. And when -- when you're -- act -- actually,  
19 who contacted you from --

20  
21 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Investigator Clemp.

22  
23 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: -- the other team? Clem (sic)?

24  
25 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Here at the Lake Elsinore station.

26  
27 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. Now, when -- when Investigator Clem  
28 contacted you, did -- did you guys have a briefing?

29  
30 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: It was Investigator Clemp.

31  
32 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Clemp?

33  
34 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: -- with a P, and then Carranza was his partner at the time.  
35 No. We did not have a briefing -- just these text messages -- hey, this is what we've got going on,  
36 and we're just utilizing you for a -- a traffic stop.

37  
38 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. And were you guys given any other  
39 information about the suspect? Any fliers?

40  
41 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: No fliers. We had a photograph, and we had a -- a  
42 general description of the model of vehicle that we were looking for -- wasn't the exact vehicle, but  
43 a similar vehicle.

1  
2 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. Now, during your -- during the  
3 surveillance -- at some point, obviously, the -- the suspect left the location; correct?  
4

5 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Correct.  
6

7 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And then what happened at that point?  
8

9 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: So we were working on an off channel -- just  
10 communicating car-to-car. The detectives put out over the radio that the car is pulled onto Lemon  
11 Street, and it was headed eastbound -- which was where we were set up.  
12

13 Deputy Birch was on a -- we were parked on -- I guess, the south side of Lemon Street just  
14 past Orchard, and -- so he would have been coming up Lemon. He made a left onto Orchard  
15 passing Deputy Birch who was in a -- an unmarked stealth unit.  
16

17 As soon as we saw the car make the left, we left our position from a parking lot and got  
18 behind the suspect vehicle.  
19

20 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And -- and, actually, how many people were  
21 involved in the surveillance -- if you -- you can recall?  
22

23 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: So the detectives -- they were a two men in an unmarked  
24 vehicle. We had -- myself and my partner in -- in a marked, two-man unit. Deputy Birch was in  
25 a -- a stealth unmarked unit by himself.  
26

27 Deputy Birch is on our PAC team. He reached out to one of his partners who was in an  
28 unmarked car who was, I think, en route, or going to be setting up nearby. We also asked a patrol  
29 unit -- Deputy Miller -- to standby and kind of -- in the area but out of the specific area.  
30

31 But we had (inaudible) him, hey, you know, you're on patrol. If you have calls or  
32 something, then go ahead and, you know, clear, and respond to those calls, but at the time, we --  
33 you know, needed him just to stand by in the area.  
34

35 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. Now, you said -- mentioned that the  
36 investigators that were working this -- a attempt murder for the past couple of weeks. What other  
37 information about the suspect did they -- they pass along to you -- as far as any -- any weapons or --  
38

39 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Other than we're assisting with the investigation a little  
40 bit -- that two people were shot. I don't remember them talking about specific crime, but a firearm  
41 was used, obviously, and we had a picture of him, his name, and then a -- a moniker of Flacko, that  
42 I recall talking to them about.  
43

1 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And you haven't dealt with this individual in the  
2 past?

3  
4 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: No, sir -- I never, didn't know who he was.  
5

6 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. So now, going back to -- once you -- the  
7 vehicle leaves, and then you guys -- you and your partner get behind the -- the vehicle -- what  
8 happened at that point?  
9

10 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: We could tell that he, obviously, recognized a police car  
11 was behind him, because he started to speed away. I activated my lights and sirens.  
12

13 Well -- just to back up. Just a sec -- we were on that car-to-car channel. As soon as we got  
14 the information that he was on the road.  
15

16 We put out, "Okay. Let's go to primary -- the primary channel with a dispatcher, and we're  
17 going to do a felony stop if -- if we -- if he stops."  
18

19 So then we get behind. I could tell he starts to speed off. I activated lights and sirens.  
20 Deputy Beudet ends up taking over radio traffic -- tries to put out a traffic stop and then,  
21 ultimately, we go into vehicle pursuit.  
22

23 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And do you recall where the pursuit initiated?  
24

25 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: We -- I activated my lights on Orchard Street, probably --  
26 I don't know the cross street, but it was between Lemon and -- I think it's Lime -- Lemon and  
27 Lime -- but I'm not exactly sure what the cross street is.  
28

29 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. But at that -- at the time you initiated the pursuit,  
30 you were broad -- broadcasting to dispatch?  
31

32 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes -- my partner was on the radio (inaudible).  
33

34 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: And -- so during the pursuit, you followed the vehicle.  
35 You pursue the vehicle until the termination point; correct?  
36

37 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Correct.  
38

39 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: During the pursuit -- if you re -- if you being recall --  
40 what was the suspect's driving actions?  
41

42 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Well, he was definitely trying to evade. He was driving  
43 fast. He was driving down the center median in the road, passed vehicles, ran stop signs, ran red

1 lights, yeah.

2  
3 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: And about what time --

4  
5 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: There was -- there was almost a collision at -- when he  
6 ran a red light at Diamond and Mission Trail.

7  
8 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And about what time of day was this?

9  
10 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I want to say it was around 3:00 p.m.

11  
12 (short pause)

13  
14 I'm not exactly sure of it.

15  
16 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. But the -- what was the traffic like on the streets?

17  
18 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: They -- it was light -- initially, it started light, and then a  
19 little bit medium when we got to the bigger -- the main -- main streets.

20  
21 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay.

22  
23 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Roads were dry. The sun was still out -- still light. I  
24 ended up taking my sunglasses off at one point.

25  
26 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: And in your best estimation, how fast was the suspect  
27 going, trying to evade you?

28  
29 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Hmmmm, I never really caught up to him, and -- to be,  
30 you know, really, really close to him. I would say, he was probably doing 100 miles an hour at  
31 some point.

32  
33 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. Now, what happened to cause the pursuit to  
34 terminate?

35  
36 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Well, we were driving on Chaney Street heading west --  
37 eastbound -- eastbound on Chaney approaching the intersection of Collier. It's a T intersection.  
38 The suspect vehicle started to veer into oncoming traffic. No other cars were there, but there was  
39 somebody stopped at the intersection.

40  
41 We were coming up behind, and I could recognize that he was going faster than -- he was  
42 going fast. He was he wasn't going to -- going to be able to navigate that turn at that speed.



1 He started to drift -- not drift -- I guess, turn to the left. He runs the stop sign into oncoming  
2 traffic -- goes across the intersection, hits a curb, goes into -- there was a driveway, but hits the curb  
3 into the driveway, and then crashes into a parked vehicle.

4  
5 I remember seeing, maybe, one female as we were driving that way near that car that was  
6 parked there -- in front -- that the suspect collided into.

7  
8 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And then what happened?

9  
10 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I was coming in behind. As I was coming to a stop,  
11 either -- I was driving behind, going to the same -- following -- get behind the suspect -- and  
12 ultimately, I don't stop in time, and I collided into the back of the suspect's vehicle.

13  
14 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And then after the collision, what happened at  
15 that point?

16  
17 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: So as I'm heading -- as I'm coming to a stop, we collide.  
18 The suspect gets out of the vehicle -- out of the driver's side. I can tell he has two firearms --  
19 semiautomatic handguns. One of them ends up falling to the ground, and as he's picking it up, I'm  
20 now opening my door.

21  
22 Suspect's -- pick up the gun turned towards me, and I end up shooting from -- I think I had  
23 one leg out of the car. I'm not -- I don't remember exactly.

24  
25 But I unholster (sic) my firearm and -- shooting the suspect through my driver's side window  
26 -- rounds through the window.

27  
28 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Now, when you say the suspect had the two guns -- was  
29 he holding both guns in his -- in his hands or -- what -- what do you mean by that?

30  
31 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Well -- well, he's -- he had one hand -- one for sure in  
32 one of his hands, and as he's picking up the second one, he's holding it, so at that moment -- then  
33 he -- by the time he's picking up the gun, I -- he has both hands -- both guns in his hands.

34  
35 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Now, when you say he was picking it up, where was he  
36 picking that -- that gun up from?

37  
38 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: So he was right next to his car, so between his driver  
39 door or by the driver area getting out and then my driver door -- so within a few feet.

40  
41 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Was the gun in the car or was it on the -- where  
42 was the gun?

1 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: One in his hand -- one on the ground.

2  
3 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Got it. And as he exited the car, you said at some  
4 point, he had turned towards you?

5  
6 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yeah. So -- but I -- what I thought was happening is as  
7 he's picking up the gun, he turned his body toward me, so as he's coming up, I believe he's going to  
8 start shooting at me, so I end up shooting through my window at him.

9  
10 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Now, when he turned towards you -- and I know it all  
11 happened in a -- in an instant, so if you can recall, great. When he started to -- to turn towards  
12 you -- have -- what was his -- his -- his body mannerisms? What -- what was the -- what was that  
13 like?

14  
15 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Oh, see, I -- I don't know. I can't recall. It happened so  
16 quickly. Yeah, I just saw guns, and it, kind of, happened -- pointing -- not pointing but facing me,  
17 and I thought he was going to, you know, ultimately, start shooting at me.

18  
19 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. At any point, do you know if the suspect fired at  
20 you?

21  
22 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I don't know.

23  
24 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Now, when you fired, you're -- what -- you said  
25 you were inside -- still inside -- or --

26  
27 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I think I --

28  
29 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: -- trying to get out.

30  
31 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I think I might have had my left foot out.

32  
33 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay.

34  
35 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: And then I was still seated -- or trying to get out or still  
36 seated somewhere in that position.

37  
38 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And if you can recall -- how -- approximately  
39 how many times do you think you fired?

40  
41 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Honestly, when -- when my sergeant asked me, I -- I -- I  
42 don't know. I don't remember that. I know I didn't go to slide lock. I do remember that. I mean, I  
43 didn't shoot all 14 bullets I had in that gun. I want to say, maybe, five. I -- I -- and I don't know.

1  
2 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And when you were -- when you were firing, was  
3 the suspect -- at the time he was firing, was he facing towards you? Was he making -- ad --  
4 advancing towards you? Or was he in a static position?

5  
6 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I think initially, it was a static, and then he began to run  
7 away.

8  
9 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. All righty. Then after you fired your weapon,  
10 what happened?

11  
12 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: As he was running with guns in hands -- both hands still  
13 firing, he gets, maybe -- I don't know, 15 to 20 yards and collapses.

14  
15 At that point, I'm trying to get out of the car, and I check on my partner, because we still -- I  
16 didn't know if there was anybody else in the vehicle, and I can see him clearing that car, so then I  
17 knew he was okay.

18  
19 Up ahead of me, there was a car parked in the parking lot, and I saw Deputy Miller at that  
20 car pointing down on the suspect, so I ran to him, and got on his back so that we can go and -- and  
21 detain or arrest the suspect.

22  
23 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Now, when you initially started shooting, about  
24 how far was the suspect from your vehicle?

25  
26 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Couple feet.

27  
28 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Couple feet?

29  
30 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yeah.

31  
32 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All righty. One second. We have the video on it, so I  
33 didn't know if you wanted to -- to try and (inaudible) the -- the video or not?

34  
35 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: It's -- it's up to you.

36  
37 [REDACTED]: Might as well go ahead and pause and then we'll --

38  
39 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And we'll go off tape briefly at 2144.

40  
41 (beeping)

42  
43 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. We're back on tape at 2157. Now, where did we

1 leave off?

2  
3 [REDACTED]: You had a chance to review the Body-Worn video?

4  
5 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes, sir, I did.

6  
7 [REDACTED] Okay.

8  
9 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: And did that refresh your memory a little bit?

10  
11 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Little bit, yeah.

12  
13 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Little bit? Okay. So, now, once the -- the shooting  
14 occurred, what happened at -- at that point? After you -- after you fired your weapon, what did you  
15 do?

16  
17 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Well, I didn't remember this until watching the video, but  
18 I -- I -- the car wasn't in park. I reached back over, put it back in park. I got out of the car, and I ran  
19 to Deputy Miller, who was up ahead.

20  
21 I remember yelling back to my partner -- because the car was still there -- "Make sure no  
22 one else was inside the car."

23  
24 He -- I think, he had mentioned something -- or said something that it was clear, and then  
25 me and Deputy Miller moved in on the suspect, and I holstered my firearm -- pulled the -- the  
26 suspect over onto his stomach and then put him in handcuffs.

27  
28 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All right. Did anyone render any medical aid?

29  
30 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yeah, I carried a -- I have a SWAT -- it's a SWAT-T™.  
31 It's like a rubberized tourniquet, so we began to pull the suspect's clothing off to see where he was  
32 shot -- to see what wounds we could try and work on.

33  
34 He had a -- a shot in his -- his leg -- so I didn't want to cause anymore -- I wanted to cut the  
35 circulation off if -- if that was going to help, so I -- I did a tourniquet on his leg between his groin  
36 and the wound.

37  
38 We got his shirt off, and we saw there was another wound in the upper chest, maybe. So I  
39 took that SWAT-T™ -- it's a -- like a rubberized tourniquet, and I cut that to -- to make a small  
40 patch, and then I used that to apply pressure to the -- the one wound.

41  
42 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: And what was that called again?

1 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: It's called SWAT, so --

2  
3 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: SWAT?

4  
5 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: -- SWAT, and then I -- like the capitalized T, like,  
6 SWAT-T™. I think that's what it is, and it's -- it's a tourniquet, medical band, yeah.

7  
8 Another deputy had a different tourniquet of -- like, a CAT 7 type tourniquet. I don't  
9 remember use -- I didn't use that one. I just did the one there, and I was holding that one for a  
10 while.

11  
12 Additional deputies responded. We had medical start to roll in, and then I was -- somebody  
13 took over holding pressure on that wound, and then Sergeant Woodland grabbed me and took me  
14 away -- or back to a different car to sit in, and then had told him my camera was still on.

15  
16 And then he said, "Okay. Go ahead and turn it off."

17  
18 Turned off my camera, got a seat in a different unit -- not mine, got a bottle of water, and  
19 just hung out -- just waited there.

20  
21 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: [REDACTED]

26 So prior -- prior to the pursuit and the off channel back and forth and being familiar with -- I  
27 guess, the investigators setting up on this -- so you knew this guy was wanted for, like, assault with  
28 a deadly weapon, attempt homicide on some victims with a gun?  
29

30 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Correct.  
31

32 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. So you had all that information. Then you get a --  
33 he's mobile. He's in his car. They're soliciting you -- because you're -- you and your partner --  
34 because you're in a black-and-white, and you're driving?  
35

36 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes, sir.  
37

38 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And who's passenger?  
39

40 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Deputy Ron Beaudet is my passenger. He's my partner.  
41

42 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Beaudet? How -- how do you spell that?  
43



1 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: B-e-a-u-d-e-t.

2  
3 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. Are you guys partners on the --

4  
5 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: We --

6  
7 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: -- on the POP team?

8  
9 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: We are the POP team, [REDACTED].

10  
11 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And you guys roll around in a --

12  
13 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: We have a marked city of Lake Elsinore Ford Explorer --  
14 markings on the side that say, "Police," and red-and-blue lights on the top.

15  
16 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. So the guy goes mobile. They solicit you to -- to  
17 make the stop on him. You're at Lemon and Orchard when you see the car coming -- activate lights  
18 and siren. That's when the guy takes off and then this whole -- this pursuit is going.

19  
20 When you're coming up -- and I'm probably going to butcher these street names, but when  
21 you're coming up Chan -- is it Chaney? Cher --

22  
23 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Right onto Chaney Street.

24  
25 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Right onto Chaney -- I didn't even know what direction  
26 that -- like, northeast, maybe --

27  
28 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I always just call it --

29  
30 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Because they're kind of angled or --

31  
32 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I call it east --

33  
34 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay.

35  
36 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: East and west and the freeway I use as north and south.

37  
38 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. So coming east on Chaney to -- looks like, he's  
39 going to make a left turn onto Collier.

40  
41 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Correct.

42  
43 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: But you say he's going way too fast, and he's not able to

1 make that turn, and he goes straight across. How far away are you from him as he's going across  
2 the intersection into that parking lot -- roughly?

3  
4 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Honestly, I don't know. I would say -- as a guess, maybe,  
5 I don't know -- 30, 40 yards.

6  
7 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay.

8  
9 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Maybe -- the entire width of the intersection.

10  
11 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. So he goes into this parking lot, and he crashes  
12 into, like, a parked car?

13  
14 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.

15  
16 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Could you see anybody in that car?

17  
18 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I didn't see anybody in the car, but I did see at least one  
19 female standing outside of the car somewhere. I just remember seeing a -- a woman standing  
20 there -- somewhere.

21  
22 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And when did you see her standing outside of the car?

23  
24 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: As I was going across the intersection, I could see up  
25 ahead what was going to happen, because I knew he wasn't going to make that turn, and his only  
26 straight avenue is either into that car, or if he was able to turn a little more, he would have went into  
27 a building.

28  
29 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. So as you're coming in -- as you're crossing the  
30 intersection, he's already crashed and come to a stop?

31  
32 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.

33  
34 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. And -- so before you go into the back of him -- is  
35 he starting to exit -- so you see this female, like, in your backdrop by that car that he just crashed  
36 into.

37  
38 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Correct.

39  
40 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Correct? And, again, she's on the passenger side or the  
41 driver's side?

42  
43 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I believe she's the passenger side.

1  
2 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So she's on the passenger side? He crashes into it.  
3 You're going through the intersection. When do you see him exit the vehicle? Is it right before you  
4 come into the back? Is it as you're entering the driveway?  
5

6 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I can't be exactly sure. My -- I would say right before the  
7 collision -- right before I collide into the back of his car.  
8

9 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. And you see him exiting the driver's side of the  
10 vehicle. You see -- he's got two guns.  
11

12 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.  
13

14 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: One in each hand.  
15

16 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.  
17

18 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And they're handguns?  
19

20 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.  
21

22 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So now you -- as you're coming up -- right before you  
23 collide into the back of him, you see him exiting the vehicle. He's got two guns in his hand. Your  
24 backdrop is a female in the car that's in front of him; right?  
25

26 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: The female would have been, I guess, downrange or  
27 down past us. Yes.  
28

29 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So -- where exactly was she standing? Near the car?  
30

31 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Near -- near her car.  
32

33 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Near the --  
34

35 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Near the car he initially crashed.  
36

37 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Crashed into so he --  
38

39 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: -- in -- which I would assume would be their car.  
40

41 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So by the drive --  
42

43 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: He was --

1  
2 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: By the driver's door?

3  
4 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I think when I first saw her, I think she was on the -- the  
5 passenger side standing by, like, maybe, front passenger or the passenger door.

6  
7 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay.

8  
9 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I'm not sure.

10  
11 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So he's getting out of the car. Two guns in his hand.  
12 She's by the passenger door, and you said then he -- it looked like he dropped one of the guns?

13  
14 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.

15  
16 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Because now, he's bent over on the ground picking it up.  
17 Do you remember which one he had dropped?

18  
19 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I don't.

20  
21 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Okay. But you knew it was a gun that he dropped?

22  
23 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yeah.

24  
25 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And as he's -- as he -- as you're coming up to him, and  
26 he's bent over now, picking this thing up -- so is it, like, his right side profile is towards you? Is  
27 he -- is he bent over facing you and picking it up?

28  
29 (short pause)

30  
31 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yeah, I would say, here, he's -- because the car was, kind  
32 of, at an angle, I would say that he was facing his car and my car -- picking it up this way. So my  
33 car would have been -- partially in front of him.

34  
35 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So his right side --

36  
37 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: (inaudible).

38  
39 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: I'm sorry.

40  
41 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I don't know if that -- if that made sense to you it's --

42  
43 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Well, let me see if it makes sense -- so part of his right

1 side and part of the front of his body is facing you?

2  
3 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Yes.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: And then he's picking the gun up, and that's when you  
6 see that -- the female in the background. You see him picking up this gun, and then that's about the

2 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: Near him -- his body. I don't know exactly where they  
3 were, but I -- I remember seeing them as I was moving toward him.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Were they in his hands? Do you remember?

7 DEPUTY MICHAEL KRAMER: I don't. I know the -- the one hand I grabbed to pull him  
8 over -- he didn't have a hand -- gun in his hand.

28 where the -- where the vehicle came to rest and where the suspect started running towards.

This item was entered into evidence at the Lake Elsinore Station.

**Details:**

On Thursday, December 20, 2018, I continued with an Officer Involved Shooting investigation. The shooting involving deputies of the Lake Elsinore Sheriff's station occurred on 12/20/18, at 11630 Collier Ave., in the city of Lake Elsinore where Armando Franco was shot by Deputy M. Kramer of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department Lake Elsinore station. At the time of the shooting, Deputy Ronald Beaudet was the passenger officer in the Sheriff's patrol vehicle driven by Deputy Kramer. After the shooting, the suspect was transported to Inland Valley Hospital, where he subsequently died as a result of his injuries. At approximately 2258 hours, I interviewed Deputy Beaudet #4513 inside of the Captain's office at the Riverside County Sheriff's Department, Lake Elsinore station. Present at the time of the interview were Inv. Moody, Deputy Beaudet with his employee representative [REDACTED]. The interview was audio recorded. The following is a summary of Deputy Beaudet's interview. For additional details, refer to the attached transcription.

I advised Deputy Beaudet that I was conducting a criminal investigation regarding the shooting and that a separate administrative investigation was being conducted by the Professional Standards Bureau. Deputy Beaudet consulted with his counsel and agreed to give a voluntary statement.

On 12/20/18 Deputy Beaudet and Deputy Kramer were contacted by Investigator Clemp of the investigations bureau to assist in a surveillance and apprehension of Armando Franco, who was wanted for 664/187, 245 PC. Franco was the suspect in a shooting that occurred on 12/15/18 at the Azteca Grill in Lake Elsinore. During the incident, two people were shot and Franco fled the scene. On 12/20/18, Investigators conducted surveillance at several locations where Franco was known to frequent. Investigator Clemp contacted Deputies Kramer and Beaudet to assist by conducting a traffic stop if Franco left the location. Deputy Beaudet said he and Kramer were in uniform and driving marked patrol unit 16021. Deputies communicated on Elsinore car to car Channel 2 during the surveillance. Deputy Beaudet was not familiar with Franco, but was aware that he was involved in the current investigation but was also suspected in being involved with a separate shooting. Deputy Beaudet was aware Franco was potentially armed.

Deputy Beaudet said he and Deputy Kramer maintained a position in the area of Mission Trail while investigators attempted to locate Franco. When Franco was located, Kramer and Beaudet were advised and attempted to conduct a vehicle stop but Franco sped off and attempted to evade deputies. Deputy Beaudet did not remember where the pursuit started but he did remember advising Sheriff's dispatch that they were in pursuit of Franco. The pursuit terminated at Chaney and Collier in the city of Lake Elsinore. At the termination point, Deputy Beaudet believed Franco lost control of his vehicle and crashed into a parked vehicle in the commercial parking lot of the location.

When Kramer and Beaudet arrived in the parking lot, they collided into the rear of Franco's vehicle. As Deputy Beaudet began to exit their vehicle, he saw the suspect armed with a handgun crouched down by the driver side of his vehicle as well as two females that were in the car Franco collided into. As Beaudet began to exit his vehicle, he heard Deputy Kramer yell, "Gun. Gun. Gun!" he then heard several gunshots. Deputy Beaudet then went to check on the females in the car while Deputy Kramer and responding deputies went to Franco who was down several feet away. Deputy Beaudet said both women were crying hysterically and one said, "He pointed a gun at me" referring to Franco. Deputy Beaudet said he did not have a clear view of Franco during the incident and was focused on trying to exit the car to engage him if needed and to check on the welfare of the women in the car.

I concluded my interview with Deputy Beaudet at 2318 hours. This report was generated to summarize my interview with Deputy Beaudet.

4 investigations, what was your assignment?

6 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: We were shorthanded staff -- just because of the -- we  
7 had a -- a different incident occurring in the city of Wildomar, so they were pinging his cell phone,  
8 and --

12 -- they had just staged us in the area of Mission Trail.

14 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Uh-huh. Oh, go ahead.

16 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Yeah, we were initially over by Mission Trail -- just  
17 parked, and as they were getting updates via cell phone, we were, kind of, just, moving around, so  
18 we drove over to the city of Lake Elsinore -- over by the mission --

19  
20 (coughing)

22 Lincoln and Machado, and did a couple trips back and forth. There was about a 15-minute  
23 delay, I guess, on the cell phone, so we were just, kind of, going back and forth trying to look for  
24 the suspect and possibly a suspect vehicle.

25  
26 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And what were you guys tasked to do by the -- by  
27 the investigation? So once -- in the event that he was -- Mr. Franco was apprehended, what was  
28 your -- what was your team's duty or responsibility in this operation?

29  
30 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: To initiate -- initiate a traffic stop and contact the suspect.

31  
32 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Okay. So during this surveillance, did you  
33 guys -- obviously, you guys saw the suspect?

34  
35 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Yes.

36  
37 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And once you guys saw -- saw the suspect,  
38 what -- what did you guys do at that point?

39  
40 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: We followed him, and, well, we positioned our patrol  
41 car -- patrol SUV behind him.

42  
43 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Uh-huh.

1  
2 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: He accelerated at a high rate of speed, and then we  
3 attempted to initiate a traffic stop, and he drove recklessly onto oncoming traffic and blew a stop  
4 sign in a residential neighborhood -- at which point, I initiated a pursuit.

5  
6 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And at what point -- I guess, when you guys  
7 initially picked him up, what -- what -- do you remember what street it was?

8  
9 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: No.

10  
11 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: The streets? When you initiated the pursuit, which  
12 streets were you on?

13  
14 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: I don't remember.

15  
16 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. But you -- you remember initiating the pursuit,  
17 though?

18  
19 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Yes.

20  
21 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And just so I have it straight -- who was the  
22 driver -- because you're a two-man unit; correct?

23  
24 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Correct.

25  
26 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: All right. Who was driving?

27  
28 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Deputy Kramer was driving.

29  
30 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And you were --

31  
32 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: And I was handling radio traffic.

33  
34 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. All righty. So as the pursuit was going on, where  
35 did the pursuit come to a termination?

36  
37 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Chaney and Collier in the city of Lake Elsinore.

38  
39 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And then at the termination point, what  
40 happened?

41  
42 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: As the suspect vehicle approached Collier from Chaney,  
43 my perception was that he lost control, and then the vehicle went into, like, a commercial parking

1 lot and struck a parked vehicle, and then our patrol car hit the suspect car.

2  
3 And I heard my partner say, "Gun. Gun. Gun" -- at which point I was trying to get out of  
4 my car -- pulling my sidearm.

5  
6 And I could hear gunshots, and I -- as I saw from my peripheral vision -- I saw the suspect's  
7 arm with -- with a handgun, and then I saw an additional car with people that looked like they were  
8 inside, and I -- I just heard gunshots.

9  
10 And then when the gunshots stopped, I popped up -- I was taking cover behind the engine  
11 block, and when I came up, suspect was down and Deputy Kramer was advancing on him, and I  
12 went to clear the suspect vehicle to make sure there was nobody in that vehicle.

13  
14 And then I contacted two females that were nearby in the parked car.

15  
16 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Now, when you say you saw the suspect with a  
17 gun -- describe that to me. What -- what was he doing with the gun?

18  
19 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: So my view was obstructed by the -- the vehicle and  
20 Deputy Kramer, so as I'm looking at the suspect vehicle, I see out of my left eye -- I see a -- just an  
21 arm with the -- with the gun coming up. I don't see -- and I see Officer Kramer, so it's almost like  
22 Kramer's here, and then in the background, I see an arm with a -- with a handgun. It was, like, a  
23 black, semiautomatic handgun, and I hear gunshots, but I don't see the suspect's body or his face.

24  
25 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Now, was the arm -- was his arm extended, or was it  
26 down at his side?

27  
28 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: It looked almost as if it was at, like, an -- an angle. I  
29 couldn't see his body, so I don't know -- I can't say in relationship to his body. I could just see -- I  
30 just remember his arm sticking out with a gun -- almost -- maybe, 45-degree angle.

43 it? Was he -- meaning, like, from your peripheral, could you tell that he was facing towards your

20 look -- I pop up. I see Kramer, and -- I don't know who the other deputies were -- a little bit further  
21 down -- a -- approaching the suspect. At that time, I see the suspect on the ground on his stomach, I  
22 believe.

23  
24 So that's when I approach. I clear the suspect car, and then I start communicating with these  
25 two women that are -- I think they were inside the -- the parked vehicle.

26  
27 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And what did the -- did the women say anything  
28 to you?

29  
30 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: They were screaming -- crying hysterically.

31  
32 One girl said, "He pointed a gun at me."

33  
34 Then there was -- the girl -- she was a Caucasian girl with like, kind of, shape -- size -- and  
35 she just kept saying she wanted [REDACTED] She -- she was hyperventilating, and then the other girl  
36 was trying to keep her -- I mean, they were both pretty hysterical.

37  
38 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: Okay. And then after your partner approached the -- the  
39 suspect who was down at this point -- what happened then? Because you stayed back with the --

40  
41 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: I stayed back.

42  
43 INVESTIGATOR JOHNSON: -- with the -- with the girls?

2 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Correct. I can see Kramer, and I don't -- again, I don't  
3 know who -- who the other -- I think -- I think it was Birch -- I know -- but I don't -- I don't know  
4 who was up there with him, but they were doing something with him -- putting handcuffs on him, or  
5 administering first aid. I can't tell.

23 right before he goes into this parking lot and crashes, he's coming up to Chaney -- is it Chaney?

23 lot, do you see the suspect get out of the car?

24  
25 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: Yes.

26  
27 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: At what point do you see the suspect getting out of the  
28 car?

29  
30 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: As we're still approaching -- as we were crossing the  
31 plain, if you will, at -- from -- from Collier -- the plain into the parking lot, I see the door open and  
32 him kind of hunched down, exiting the vehicle.

33  
34 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: Could you tell what he was doing?

35  
36 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: No.

37  
38 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So you only really saw, like, the top of his head?

39  
40 DEPUTY RONALD BEAUDET: At that point, I see -- I see a -- probably, I would say  
41 from his torso -- his waistband, maybe, up, I see him getting out of the car. We collide. I kind of  
42 lose my bearings directly after --  
43

1 (coughing)

2  
3 -- after we rear-end him.

4  
5 And then, kind of, simultaneously, that's when I hear Kramer say, "Gun. Gun. Gun."

6  
7 And then I -- I'm trying to get out, and I look, and then that's when I see an arm like this, and  
8 I hear the gunshots.

10 INVESTIGATOR MOODY: So as the -- as the suspect's getting out of the car, is -- is  
11 he facing away from you guys? Is he facing towards you? Can you see his torso up?





6 On Thursday, December 20, 2018, 4:30pm, Riverside County Sheriff Department's Central Homicide Unit  
7 Investigator Anthony Johnson with an Officer Involved Shooting incident that occurred earlier that day in Lake  
8 Elsinore, CA. Inv. Johnson requested I respond to Inland Valley Medical Center and check on the status of  
9 Armando Franco, whom was shot during the incident.

11 At 6:45pm, I arrived at the hospital and met the Operating Room Nurse [REDACTED] RN. Nurse  
12 [REDACTED] stated Armando was brought to the hospital with multiple gunshot injuries and was rushed into the  
13 operating room for immediate medical treatment. Nurse [REDACTED] explained the surgery was over and he was  
14 expected to survive. Armando remained in the OR and was later moved to the Intensive Care Unit.

16 After meeting with Nurse [REDACTED] I spoke with Lake Elsinore Sheriff Station Deputy Brad Foster. He was  
17 assigned to monitor Armando while he was admitted into the hospital. Dep. Foster received Armando's  
18 personal belongings and maintained them while he was at the hospital.
